

On <u>Palm Sunday</u> we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem; then we move on to be with Our Lord in His Passion.



The **Great Easter Triduum**

Begins with the <u>Mass of the Lord's Supper</u>; we re-call Jesus' loving service as he washes the Disciples' feet. For the first time Jesus takes the Bread: "This is my body"

and takes the Cup: "This is my blood".

After this <u>Maundy Thursday Mass</u> we are invited to watch with the Lord in prayer as he prepares to be betrayed.

On Good Friday

we are with Jesus in his suffering and death on the Cross. In the afternoon <u>Liturgy of the Passion</u> we hear the story of Jesus' death from John's Gospel; we pray; we venerate the Cross and receive Holy Communion.

We can also draw close to Our Lord in the Walks of Witness and Stations of the Cross.

On Holy Saturday

At the <u>Easter Vigil</u> we move from the darkness of the tomb to the glorious light of the Risen Lord. We hear God's word, renew our Baptismal promises and celebrate the First Mass of Easter.
