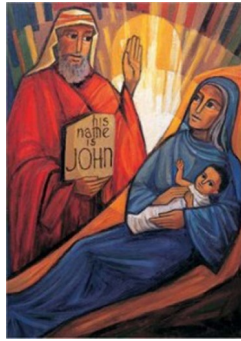

Jesus brings life where there seems to be no hope.

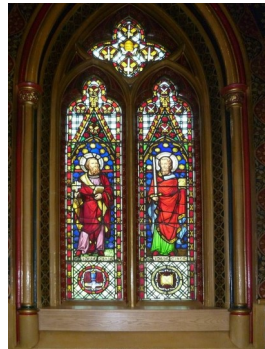
St Peter & St Paul 29th June

Masses for the Feast of St Peter & St Paul Tues 29th June:

St Giles': 10.00am & 7.00pm
St Thomas': 9.15am

The Feast of St Peter & St Paul would usually be a Holyday of Obligation.

As we celebrate their lives and their deaths we ask them to pray for us.



As we all know, the possible relaxing of COVID-19 related restrictions has been postponed until July 19th at the earliest.

Masses will definitely remain as they are until Friday 30th July.

Any changes in Mass times and in the way we celebrate Mass, will be from Saturday 31st July.

From Saturday 31st July there will no longer be Saturday Vigil Masses at St Giles' at 3.00pm & 6.00pm.

Saturday Vigil Mass will definitely return to the former time of 5.00pm from Saturday 31st July.

Whatever the changes in regulations may be, this is necessary to allow for weddings on Saturdays.

Baptisms can be arranged with Fr Eric. Until further notice all Baptisms are on Saturdays at St Thomas', Tean at 11.00am. Maximum attendance at Baptisms is currently 30.

Numbers able to attend any services other than Baptisms (Mass, Weddings or Funerals etc) are currently limited to the capacity of the Church with people masked & socially distanced: 60 at Cheadle; 35 at Tean.

If it is safe to re-open St Giles' Church building with unrestricted access for personal prayer and general visiting, the earliest possible date for re-opening will be Monday 2nd August.
