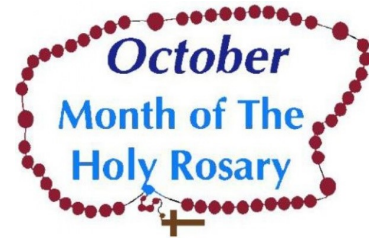

In love, Jesus sees that he is able to go much further. The time is right for him to give up wealth, to give to the poor and to follow Jesus.

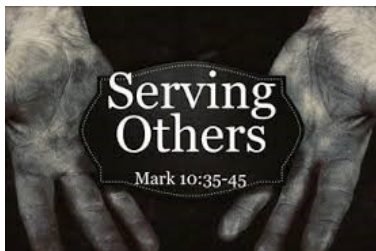
The young man prefers his security & status to the fullness of life he is offered in love.

### SVP Mass & Meeting

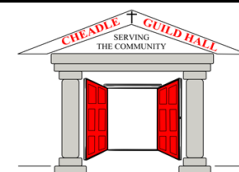
Mon 11th October 6.00pm Mass in Church

To enable the replacement of the roof to go ahead, St Giles' Parish gave £5,000 & loaned £70,000 to the Guild Hall. We are delighted to report that owing to people's generosity & careful stewardship of resources, £20,000 has been repaid to the Parish. So the Guild Hall now owes the Parish £50,000.
