Thought for the Week.

Our Gospel today is the prayer of Jesus just before His arrest and has several important themes. Jesus' prayer reaffirms the complete union between Him and the Father. Throughout St John's Gospel, Jesus is presented as the one who pre-existed with the Father, the Word made flesh who is sent by the Father to do His work on earth. In today's reading, we hear Jesus ask that the unity He experiences with the Father be extended to all who believe in Him. He prays that we be one with each other, one with Him, and one with the Father. His prayer reminds us that Christ is the source of Christian unity. In and through Christ we are united with one another, we are brothers and sisters even with those we have never met. We are also united to and children of God our Father. The reason Jesus performs signs and the reason John records those signs in his Gospel is so that we may believe in Jesus as the Christ and that believing we may have life through Him. Jesus prays not only for those who believe in Him but for all who will come to believe in Him so that the love of the Father in Him may also be in all who believe and that Jesus might be in them as well.

They will travel to London next month with their friends from Uttoxeter, Cheadle and Caverswall to attend this Mass. Coaches don't come cheap of course. Over £1,000 for the trip so it was heartening that the cake sale after Mass last Sunday was such a success. That was without using the trump card of putting the children behind the stall!
