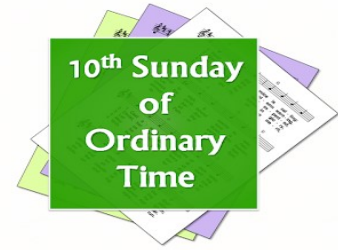

Thought for the Week.

Today our readings begin with God questioning Adam in the garden. Adam, aware of his sinfulness, related as nakedness, hiding from God. But no one can hide from God, He knows everything and so He asks Adam if he has disobeyed God's will symbolized in the eating of the forbidden fruit. Adam's answer is typical of all humanity; he passes the blame, it was not his fault. God, however, knows that both Adam and Eve are culpable for their disobedience. The narrative continues with God's words to the Serpent, who here represents the Devil. He speaks of enmity between the woman and the serpent, her offspring and his. God says that her offspring will crush the head of the serpent. This is the way to kill the serpent and that the serpent will continue to tempt the human race; the heel is our most vulnerable part. But the Church sees these also as a prefigurement of the Covenant God makes with Abraham, Moses and His People Israel. Here the Woman of whom God speaks is Mary; her offspring is Jesus. God is saying that Jesus will crush sin. Through his passion, death and Resurrection Jesus did indeed conquer sin. Satan no longer has any power over us. Our sins are forgiven and we are restored to the life God intended when He first created Man and Woman. He knows our faults and there is no need for us to hid from Him because Jesus has taken our faults with Him to the Cross and by His wounds we are healed.
